The European AIDS Treatment Group invites you to a stakeholders' meeting to share findings from the SCOPE project: community research, capacity-building and community networking. The meeting will review how the SCOPE initiative has and can continue to expand community representation in policy-making, to generate data to inform programming and to develop tools for awareness-raising and advocacy. Project participants share their experience and lessons learnt since 2022. SCOPE researchers will present their work. This will be followed by an exchange on community priorities to strengthen access to combination prevention in the coming years.

Started in 2022, the [SCOPE project](#)¹ (Strategic Community HIV Prevention Empowerment) aims at strengthening community engagement at local and regional levels to reduce the gap in access and use of HIV combination prevention interventions by populations that are most affected by HIV, but which remain inadequately served by health systems and which are underrepresented in policy and public debates.
