

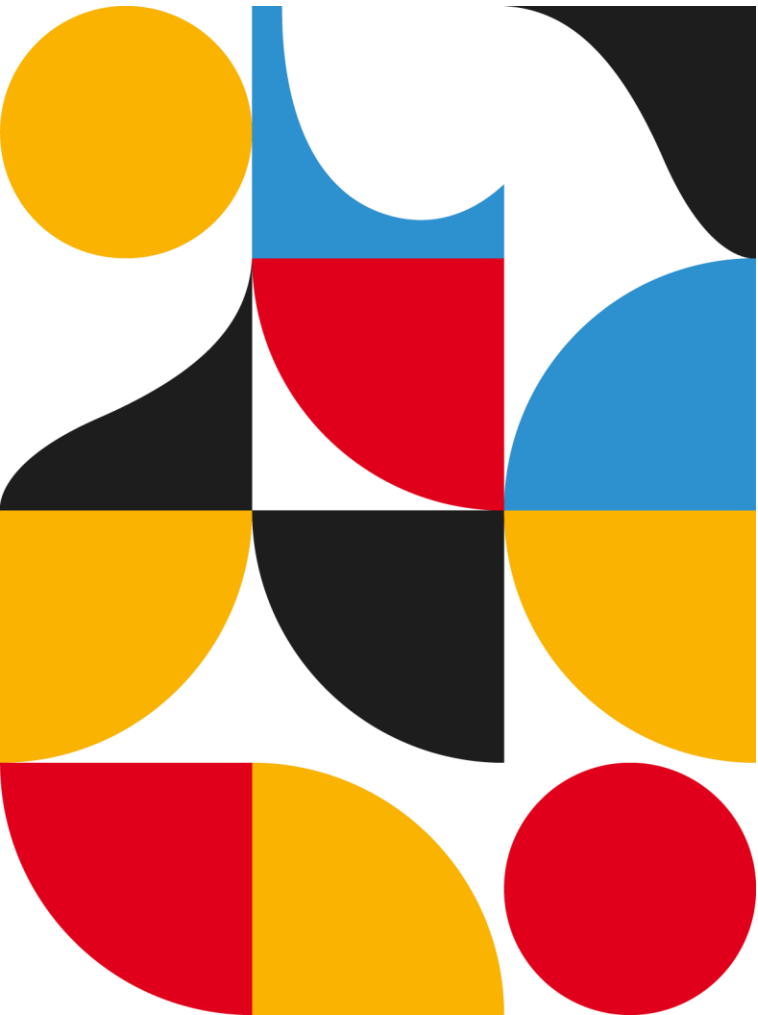

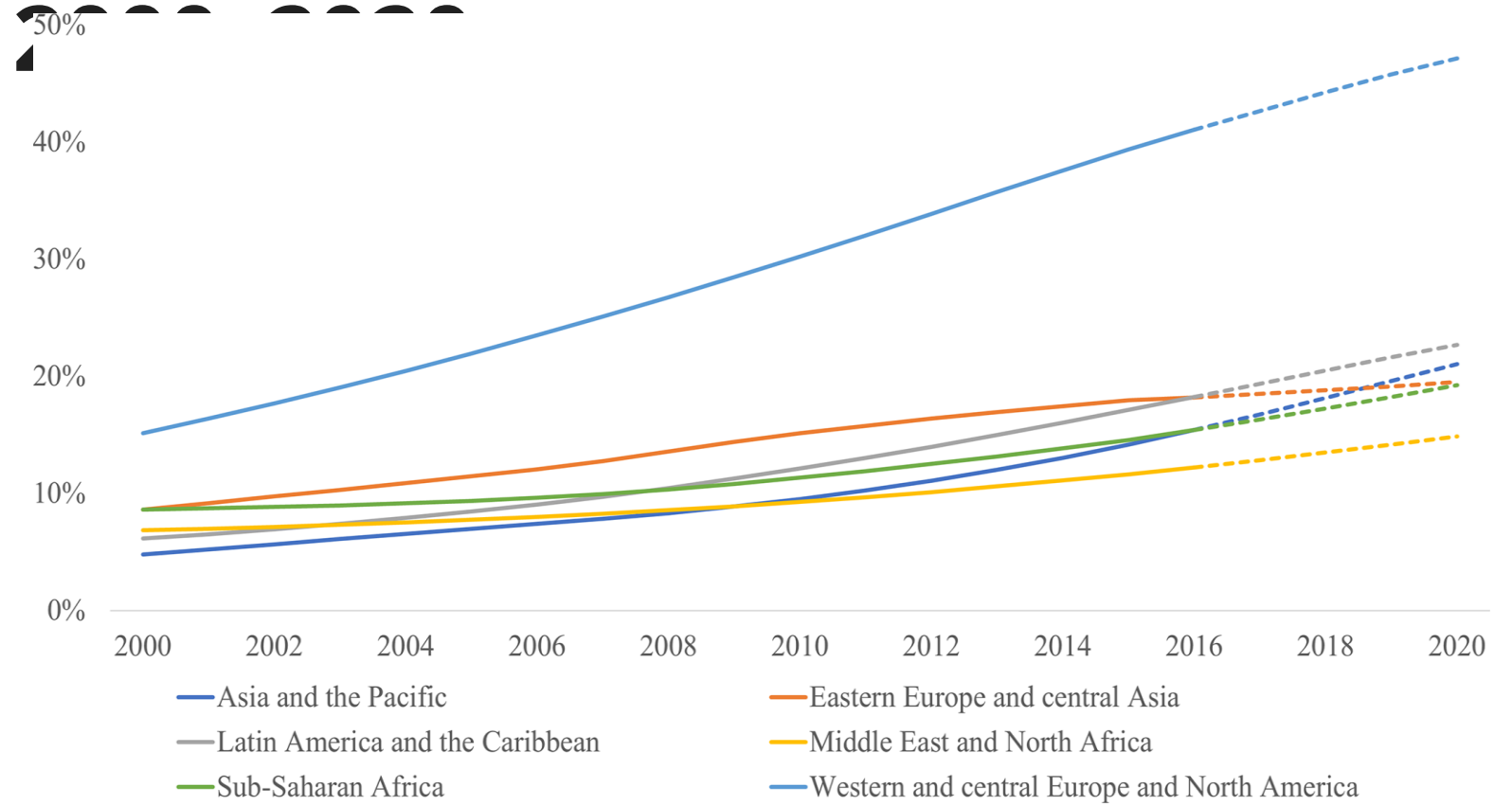

Global trends of people living with HIV aged 50 and over: Estimates and projections for 2000–2020

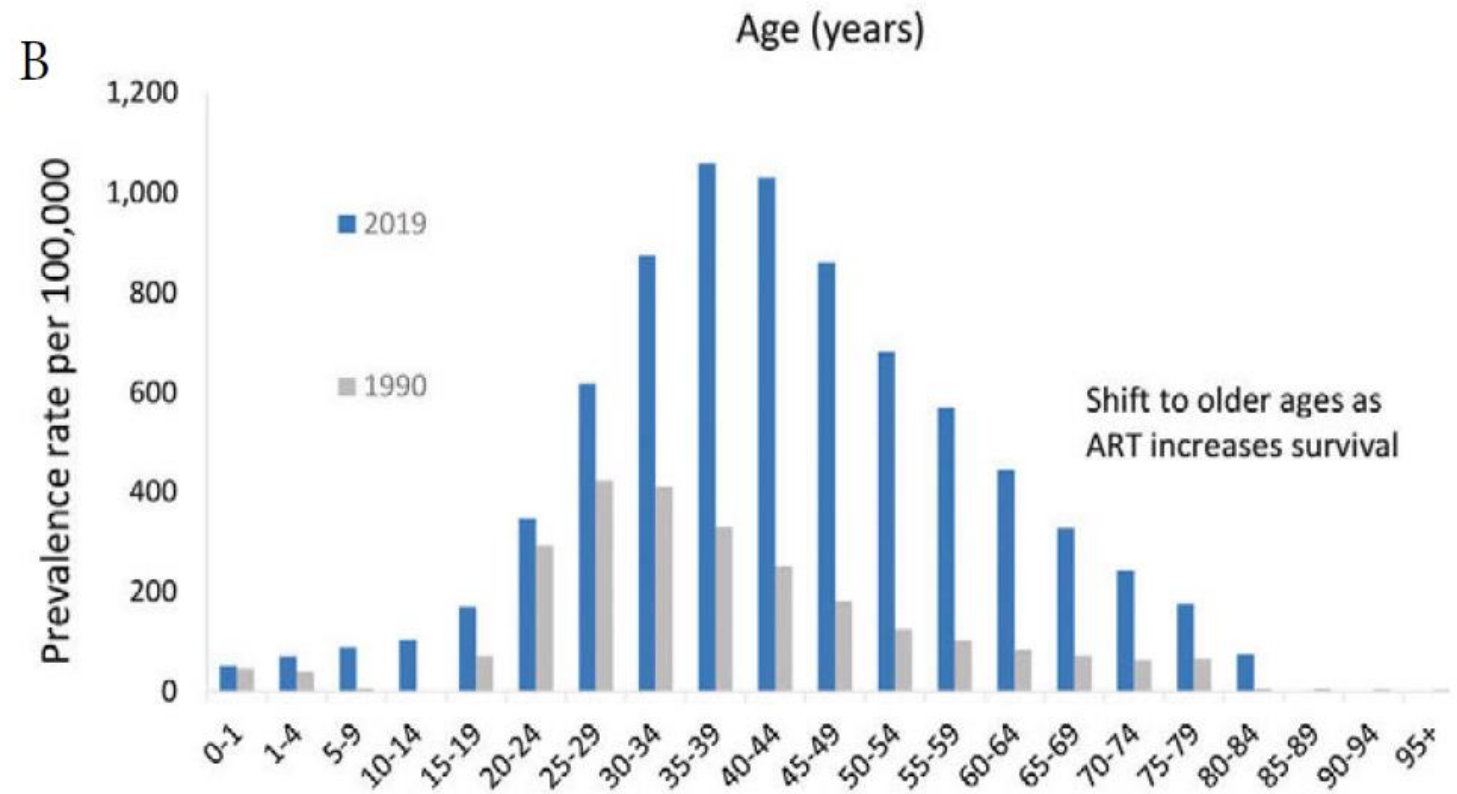


Proportion of people living with HIV who are aged 50 years and older, by region, 2000–2020

Age distribution of HIV/AIDS worldwide: Prevalence 1990 vs. 2019

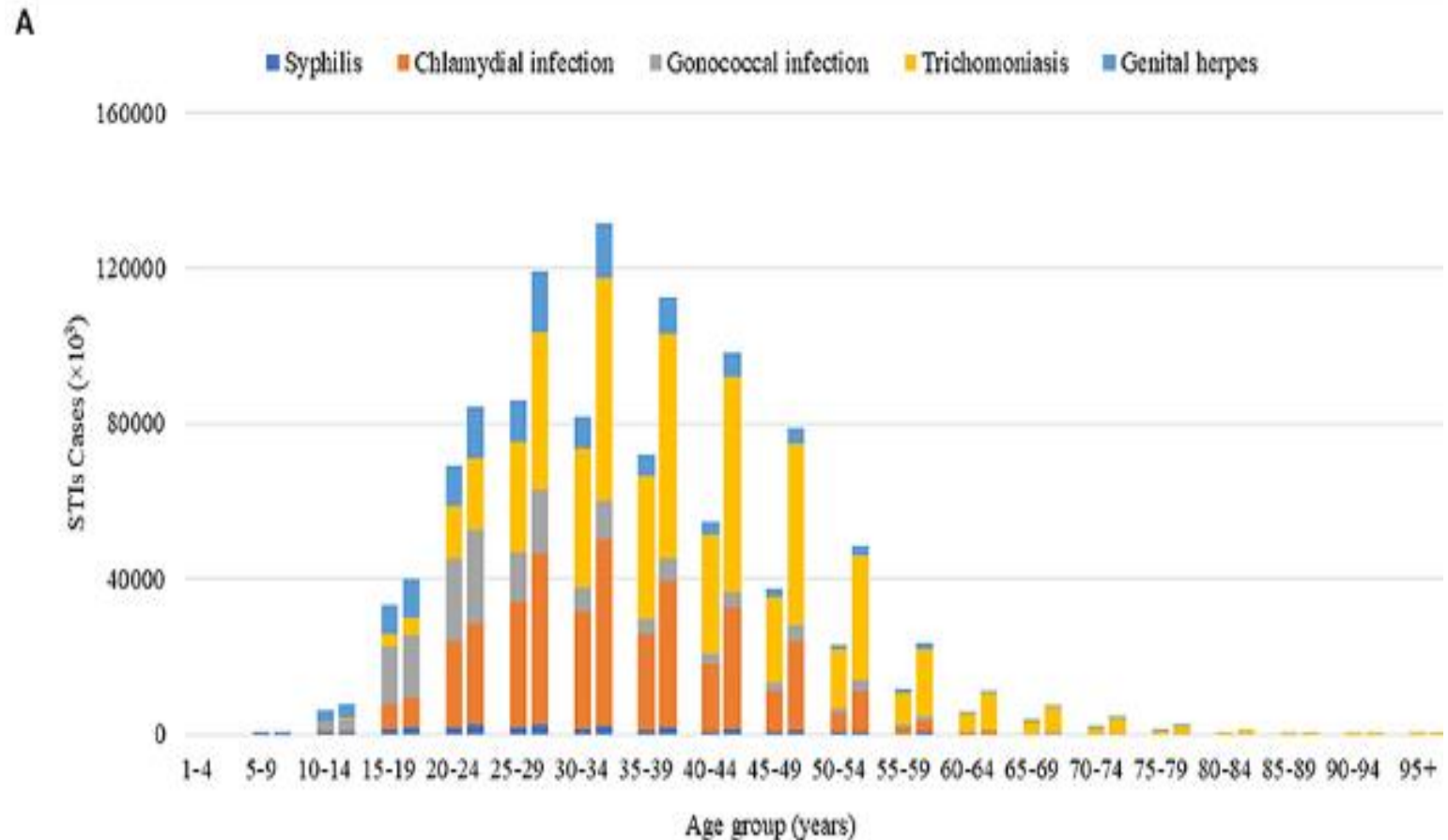
The ageing of the cohorts living with HIV
