The Strategic Community HIV Prevention

Empowerment – SCOPE - project aims to strengthen community engagement at local and regional levels to reduce the gap in access and use of HIV combination prevention interventions by populations that are most affected by HIV, but which remain inadequately served by the health system and which are underrepresented in

policy and public debate.

Project PROMise: The overall goal of the project is to establish a guidance document and recommendations for the consideration of HIV-specific Patient Reported Outcome Measures (PROMs) in HIV R&D in collaboration with key stakeholders from community organisations, academia, industry, regulators and Health Technology Assessment (HTA) bodies.

Project BELONG: The overall goal of this advocacy project is to produce a position paper that advocates for the inclusion of people living with (as suggested by the FDA) HIV in clinical research to be mirrored by European countries and regulated by the EMA, not only for cancer trials, but also for other disease areas.

From March 2020 to January 2021, EATG documented the impact of the disruption caused by the ShapeSARS-COV2 pandemic on people living with or most affected by HIV and solutions found to mitigate it, including at community level. EATG published 6 bulletins, organised mutual learning e-meetings on HIV self-testing, ensuring continuity in sexual health services, COVID-19 vaccines, adaptation of services at community level:
